## **Event Overview and Strategic Summary**

The **6th Global Sustainability Summit & Expo 2025**, organized by the MSME Chamber of Commerce and Industry of India (MSMECCII), was successfully held in New Delhi, bringing together industry leaders, policymakers, and innovators. The event focused sharply on sustainable development across key sectors, with a significant emphasis on issues directly relevant to the plastics industry and the broader manufacturing ecosystem.

## **Key Thematic Focus Areas**

The Summit's agenda was highly relevant to GSPMA members, particularly due to the specific focus on resource management and future technology:

## 1. Plastics and Resource Efficiency:

- The discussions heavily featured innovations in plastic recycling and wasteto-wealth initiatives.
- The core message was the need to transform plastic waste into valuable, reusable materials, promoting a circular economy and minimizing pollution.
- This segment is crucial for guiding GSPMA members in adopting sustainable packaging solutions and enhancing their recycling capabilities.

## 2. Future Technologies and Clean Energy:

- Sessions covered the critical role of renewable and sustainable energy sources (solar, wind, hydro) in reducing carbon emissions.
- Future-focused discussions explored advancements in Electric Vehicles (EVs), lithium storage, and green hydrogen—all of which necessitate resourceefficient manufacturing and specialized materials.

## 3. E-Waste Management and MSME Potential:

- The Summit addressed the growing crisis of e-waste, emphasizing the importance of recovering valuable materials from discarded electronics, including the efficient recycling of lithium batteries to enhance EV sustainability.
  - A dedicated focus explored the potential of the MSME sector in driving these sustainable development and innovation efforts across all key areas.

# Event Report: 12th Specialty Films & Flexible Packaging Global Summit & Expo 2025

India successfully hosted the world's largest Films & Flexible Packaging Summit on 3–4 September 2025 at the Reliance Jio World Convention Centre, Mumbai. Organized by ElitePlus++ Business Services and supported by the Department of Chemicals & Petrochemicals (DCPC), Government of India, the event reinforced its position as the global benchmark for the packaging industry.

## **Record Participation**

The two-day mega event witnessed record participation with 2,200+ delegates from 800 companies across 26 countries. The audience comprised global leaders, brand owners, recyclers, converters, raw material suppliers, policymakers, automation experts, and sustainability innovators.



# **India's Strategic Role**

A defining highlight of this edition was India's strategic role in the global packaging market, driven by the Make in India vision and policies promoting Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR), recycling, and circular economy practices. The summit also emphasized the convergence of rigid and flexible packaging, positioning them as complementary solutions in multi-format consumer strategies.

## **Program Highlights**

The program featured 85 global leaders who addressed 10 business sessions and 7 panel discussions covering growth opportunities, new trends, and sustainability. Keynotes came from industry leaders at Godrej Industries, Reliance Consumer Products, Marico, Bisleri, Bandhan Bank, and the Alliance to End Plastic Waste, while PepsiCo and McKinsey & Company delivered plenary sessions on consumer insights and packaging transformation. A special Economic Outlook Address highlighted trade shifts, tariff wars, and regional alliances, while delegates also reviewed outcomes of the INC-5.2 Treaty and their implications for India.

- Digital transformation through AI, smart solutions, and data-driven manufacturing.
- Next-gen materials such as mono-materials, coatings, adhesives, recyclability, and barrier technologies.
- Disruptive innovations like chemical recycling, rPET, automation, traceability, and decarbonization.
- Sectoral applications across FMCG, food, pharma, healthcare, e-commerce, EVs, and solar.
- Panel highlights: sustainability business cases, raw material innovations, flexible—rigid synergies, start-up funding, plastics circularity, and rising Indian brands.

The following points regarding GST 2.0 Reforms were highlighted during the discussion:

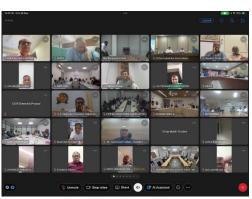
- **Historical Context**: A review of the history of GST and its journey over the years.

## **BRIEFING NOTE: PARLIAMENTARY STANDING COMMITTEE VISIT**

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Department-Related Parliamentary Standing Committee on Industry conducted a study visit to **Ahmedabad, Gujarat, on September 13, 2025**, to conduct a comprehensive, on-theground review of two critical initiatives affecting the Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprise (MSME) sector. The primary goal of the visit was to gather direct feedback for legislative review and policy course correction to enhance the efficacy of these programs.

## **Stakeholder Engagement**

The Committee engaged a diverse range of key players, including the **Chief Secretary of Gujarat**, representatives from the **Ministry of MSME**, **MSME Associations**, the **Khadi & Village Industries Commission (KVIC)**, and major **Public Sector Banks** (including SBI, Union Bank, Indian Bank, and Canara Bank). The Committee also met with senior management from key **Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs)**, such as BPCL, RailTel, IRCTC, and SAIL.





## **Core Review Focus**

The deliberations were structured into two distinct sessions focusing on the following:

- PM Vishwakarma Scheme: The review assessed ground-level implementation status, covering artisan registration, skill training, toolkit distribution, and market linkages. A critical focus was placed on the banking sector's role in ensuring the timely and hassle-free disbursement of credit and financial assistance to beneficiaries.
- 2. Public Procurement Policy for MSMEs: This review focused on CPSEs' compliance with the mandatory 25% procurement target from Micro and Small Enterprises (MSEs). A significant portion of the discussion was dedicated to the critical issue of delayed payments to small vendors, aiming to identify measures to safeguard the financial health and operational stability of the MSME ecosystem.

# Startup Conclave & Exhibition – 2025, Gandhinagar

#### Overview

The Startup Conclave & Exhibition 2025 was inaugurated by Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah in the presence of Chief Minister Shri Bhupendra Patel, marking Gujarat's continued leadership in the startup revolution. The event aimed to advance Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's vision of "Mind to Market" and strengthen India's global standing as a hub for innovation and entrepreneurship.



India's startup ecosystem has witnessed remarkable growth, recording a 380% surge in the past decade with over 1.92 lakh startups, 120+ unicorns, and a combined valuation exceeding USD 350 billion. The country has advanced from 91st to 38th in the Global Innovation Index, aiming to reach the top 10 within three years, while women-led enterprises now account for 48% of startups and 37% originate from Tier-2 and Tier-3 cities, together generating 17.9 lakh jobs nationwide.





Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah emphasized how startups have transformed India's youth into job creators, supported by initiatives such as the ₹10,000 crore Fund of Funds, higher loan limits, tax exemptions, PLI schemes, and reforms in GST and law simplification. Gujarat emerged as the leading startup state with over 16,000 startups, including 6,650 in Ahmedabad.

Chief Minister Shri Bhupendra Patel highlighted Gujarat's efforts under "Make in India, made for the World," expanding exports in defense and toys, fostering digital adoption through UPI, and supporting innovation with i-Hubs, AI Labs, and the ₹350 crore Gujarat Young Entrepreneurs Venture Fund, resulting in more than 12,500 active startups in the state.
